OVERVIEW ON REDEMPTION

Theme of Redemption: Naomi goes from **emptiness** (1:21) to **fullness** (4:15).

What it means to be redeemed: To recover ownership of by **paying a specified sum** (an **exchange**).

Qualifications of a Kinsmen Redeemer: Had to have the **right** to redeem (kinsmen, Ruth 3:12-13); had to have the **power** to redeem (Redeemer, Ruth 4:4-6).

A Kinsmen Redeemer redeemed the following three things: **Persons**, **Property** and **Posterity**.

Christ is our Kinsmen Redeemer: Galatians 4:3-7.

His redemption of us, like that of Boaz for Ruth, was not a **requirement**.
