BIBLE IN A YEAR- Joshua

The first five Books of Moses (Gen. through Deut.) lead the children of Israel up to Canaan; Joshua leads the children of Israel into Canaan. The remainder of the historical books (Joshua thru Esther) covers Israel's history inside the land.

NAME AND STRUCTURE

Joshua's original name was Hoshea ([Num. 13:8](#); [Deut. 32:44](#)) which means literally "salvation." But during the wilderness wanderings Moses changed his name to *Yehoshua*, meaning "Yahweh is salvation" or "save, Yahweh" ([Num. 13:16](#)). Joshua is a contracted form of *Yehoshua*.

Entering the Land

- 1) Joshua Commissioned (Ch. 1): His authority based on the **Word of God**
- 2) Jericho Spied (Ch. 2): Reflects the difference between **believing** and **presuming**.
- 3) Jordan Crossed (Ch. 3): One thing to leave **Egypt**, quite another to enter **Canaan**.
- 4) Memorials Raised (Ch. 4): Memorials reminded them of God's **Power** and God's **Faithfulness**
- 5) Covenant Sealed (Ch. 5): Spoke of **Moral** and Spiritual **Separateness**

Overcoming the Land

- 1) The Fall of Jericho (Ch. 6): Must do **exactly** what God commanded.
- 2) The Sin of Achan (Ch. 7): One sin affected the **whole camp**
- 3) The Conquest of the Land (Ch. 8-12): After sin **confessed and dealt with**, Israel was victorious.

Remarkable parallel between Joshua and **Ephesians**. In Joshua, Israel enters and possesses the **earthly inheritance** given to Abraham. In Ephesians, we see the **church** entering and possessing the **heavenly inheritance** given to us in Christ.
