## BIBLE IN A YEAR- Romans

### Paul's Theology

**Center:** God's Grace toward His Weak and Sinful creatures (I Cor. 15:9-10)

**Context:** The "Powerful" and the "Powerless" ("Strong" and "Weak").

**Content:** Revelation of the Righteousness of God (Rom. 1:16-17).

- o Righteous: Condition of being Acceptable.

### The Book of Romans

- Written by Paul from Corinth in AD 57, about 7 years before Roman fire in AD 64.
- Paul had hoped to visit Rome (1:9-13), but ended up going in chains (Acts 28:16).
- Establishes need for Doctrine and Discipline prior to a "Storm".

1. It is not present in humans because of sin (Rom. 1-3); Rom. 2:1-3, 3:23
2. It is imputed unto us when God justifies us by faith (Rom 4-5); Rom. 4:1-8
3. It is demonstrated as we go from "demons" to disciples (Rom. 6-8); Rom. 7:22-25
4. It is to be applied in practical ways throughout life (Rom. 12-16); Rom. 12:1-2
